Now that October has arrived, the museum is "closed" for the season. National Endowment of the Humanities (NEH) Grant Received!

We are excited to announce that our research partner, Ball State University's Applied Anthropology Laboratories, was awarded a \$200,000 grant from the NEH! This funding will enable the museum exhibit *St. Clair's Defeat Revisited: A New View of the Conflict*, to travel to four different venues starting in 2023. These exhibit locations include the Fort Recovery Museum, the Fort Wayne History Center, Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College in Miami, Oklahoma, and the Ohio History Center in Columbus.

This innovative exhibit was co-created WITH tribal members (Delaware Nation, Delaware Tribe of Indians, Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma, Miami Tribe of Oklahoma, Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians, Seneca-Cayuga Nation, Shawnee Tribe, Ottawa Tribe of Oklahoma, Wyandotte Nation), perhaps setting a pattern and relationship for future projects involving similar topics/history.

The Fort Recovery Historical Society and State Museum give a tip of the hat to Archaeologist, Chris Thompson of Ball State University's Applied Anthropology Laboratories for her commitment and years of work to successfully accomplish this major and important project.
